They cannot come up with any new information. But they can save much time and work. For example, all the information and the office files can be stored in a computer's "memory". If a clerk were to trace any information from a particular file, the computer would only take seconds to find it. It would take a clerk days or even weeks to go through every file if no computers were used.

The first computers were huge and costly. They filled up almost the whole floor of large offices. They invented chips which made it possible to store more information in less space.

Robots, on the other hand, are not mechanical people. They are only moving parts controlled by a computer.
