State of U.P.* [(1964) 1 SCR 332] as well as Nine Judges' Constitutional Bench decision in the case of *Justice K. S. Puttaswamy (Retd.) & another v. Union of India* (Writ Petition (Civil) No. 494 of 2012).

OR

Discuss the Quasi-federal structure of the Constitution of India having concentration of powers at the Centre in the emergency with the help of appropriate decisions of the Supreme Court of India.

Discuss in detail with the help of the decided cases of the Supreme Court of India how the Supreme Court has expanded the scope of Article 12 of the Constitution of India. Whether Board of Cricket Control of India is a State under Article 12? Answer with relevant decision.

OR

Explain in detail the view of the Supreme Court in the matter of reservation in public employment with relevant cases. Give your opinion as a researcher in law about the present reservation policy in public employment.

Explain briefly the contribution of the Supreme Court in developing the compensatory jurisprudence through its decisions.

OR

"Right to strike is not a fundamental Right." Do you agree with this statement? Answer in brief taking into consideration the judgments of the Supreme Court of India.

Critically discuss the grounds on which the Supreme Court has declared National Judicial Commission Act, 2014 as unconstitutional and adequacy of present collegium system on appointment of Judges.

Explain in detail the freedom of Press in India with the help of the relevant decisions of the Supreme Court of India. How freedom of press in India differs from that in USA?

Critically discuss any one from the following :

- (1) Case : *S. R. Bommai v. Union of India* and its subsequent effects.
- (2) Constitutional Provisions relating to Inter State Water Dispute.
- (3) Merits and demerits on the right of Access to information.
